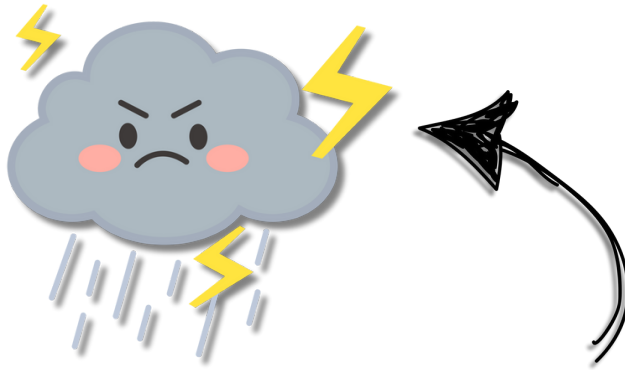

Note: In Elfdalian, the “the” form of a word, known formally as the definite form, is a suffix that is added to the end of the word. The ending added depends on the gender, case and number. For simplicity’s sake, the definite form of all words are provided underneath the dictionary form, as pictured above.
